Harradine stars to reclaim his Men's Open title at Sharjah

Michael Harradine of the Jebel Ali Golf Resort & Spa regained his Sport360° Men's Open Golf Championship title that he last won in 2011 with an unbelievable second round course record score of four under 68.

Leading after day one at one under, Harradine, who first won the title in 2010, came under pressure from a number of players all within five strokes of the lead.

Thomas, who is just 14 years old, once again showed huge maturity to compete with older and more experienced golfers, and took away a huge amount of respect and praise from his fellow competitors.

The third spot went to Sharjah Golf and Shooting Professional Trevor Marshall who matched his first round score of 73 to complete the 36 holes in a two over 146 total.

Marshall was pleased with his efforts over the two days and praised the superb golf produced by Harradine.
